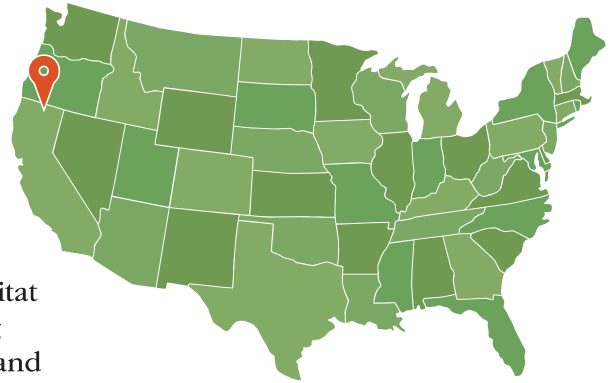

## REASON FOR PLANTING



- Restoring tree cover in areas devastated by multiple wildfires
- Reestablishing critical habitat for area wildlife, including the northern spotted owl and endangered Coho salmon
- Providing slope stability and a reduction in potential long-term erosion
